Minutes of June 23, 2011

Meeting was **called to order** by President Sandra Storm at 6:30pm at McElwain Church.

Signature **roll** sheet sent for attendees to sign.

Minutes of the May 26, 2011 amended to say Festival Shopping Center instead of Wildwood in the last paragraph of page two. Motion by Betty Bamburg, second by Eva Honeycutt, motion carried.

In **unfinished business**, Pres. Storm reported that work on the hidden Crestline Park has started, this work is being done by the city. Todd Russell and the Crestline Park Lawn Society are monitoring the work and no grassy areas have been harmed by equipment. The work has not begun on the drainage issue yet. Todd also told Pres. Storm that the variance work we approved on his Baker St. home has begun. President Storm **reported** that the Mt. Brook City Council spent an hour at a recent meeting discussing the WalMart Market issue at the old ballfield across from Trinity on Montclair. It is understood that they will be in contact with Baptist Health System board members. It was pointed out that spot zoning is frowned upon. Sandra Storm feels that WalMart is powerful and BHS will probably go forward. Also, Redmont NA voted to support us in our resolution against the WalMart Market and keeping the Montclair property zoned residential.

In **new business**, Margaret Brent of Leach Ct., a closely knit cul-de-sac neighborhood off Brook Way, apprised us of the fact that their aging neighbors are selling their homes, hoping buyers will be young families. Alas, one home has been sold as a rental and it looks like a large group of young people will be moving end. There is a law in place in the City of Birmingham that limits the number of single, unrelated tenants to THREE. Sandra called the new owner and told him of this law. She will followup and make sure laws are not broken.

William Darby of BPL at Shops of Montevallo reported that the Summer Reading Program is in progress. In addition, PPL and the Jefferson County Cooperative are still requesting donations to keep van delivery of materials to the Cooperative and other programs alive. He also told us that the management company for Shops of Montevallo is taking bids to repair the sign and landscape at the entrance.

This Saturday night there will be a vigil at Lynn Park about the new Immigration law. The Crestline Church at Haygood and Dunstan will be showing "August Rush" tonight, Friday, June 24.

Call to **adjourn** was made by Eva Honeycutt and seconded by Mary Brent. All were in agreement. Meeting adjourned at 7:27pm.
