CRR Pamela Coulon gave updates on City information (~~attachments follow~~).

Environmental forms for complaints will be available at our next meeting for neighbors to fill out and give to Pamela at meetings- see podium for forms. Toys for Tots will be collected at all Fire Stations and City Hall.

Environmental Marty Martin reported when asked, that ridding of kudzu overgrowth is going to 2-3years, this in response to a request for help with overgrowth on Grace Baker between Winn Dixie and Publix. The new Mayor will be deciding if Green Wave program will be continued. We are hoping Green Wave will do its work during winter when grass and weeds are not growing. The 4300 Warren Rd. ditch project is being researched by Councilman Hunter Williams. A report of the house across from Hagood at Montevallo was made.

City Councilor Hunter Williams introduced his Office Manager India Bailey. Hunter is on the Safety Committee. Projects which have been funded will go through. The Five Year Paving plan has only been funded for year one – Groover was the only street on the list and it has been paved. He is asking us to set goals for our Neighborhood in the next four years. Your input will be requested.

Under other business, Teri Wright, Eastwood Neighborhood, invited C N A to Pot Luck dinner on Thursday, December 7, 2017. She also reported on the problems getting the City to put reflectors along Elder St., which were in the process but the project was pulled because the City did not want to take legal responsibility. She also told us of Eastwood NUSA request for program highlighting Putnam garden, Flora Johnson Nature Park, and a meal and music at Putnam School.

Carol Slaughter brought up the matter of a problem at 1329 Wales where multiple cars are parked on the street that are tagless or with out of date car tags. After police report - meter maid was sent who had no clue as to how to handle, Police were sent - the cars were ticketed, but then were just moved to the yard. There is presently a half a car sitting visible in the side yard. Code enforcement has been alerted. Carol's problem is that laws are being violated and there is little to no code enforcement by City & if you handle the complaint improperly, you could be sued by the property owner.
